Awards for this Show:

- Each Class: 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each class will be identified as determined by the Judge.
- An Honourable Mention will be awarded if the Judge deems a specimen to be of merit.
- Year-End Champion Points: Points earned for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each class will be tracked by the Statistician towards the determination of year-end awards/champions for the 2024 calendar year.
- Judge’s Choice Awards: A gift certificate of \$25.00 from one of the MHS sponsors will be awarded as determined by the judge as follows:
 - Division 1 – Horticulture Specimen Classes – Classes 1 to 27

Class 1	<i>Iris</i> - Any iris in bloom	1 stalk
Class 2	<i>Muscari</i> (Grape hyacinth) - same variety, same colour	3 stems
Class 3	<i>Narcissu</i> (Narcissus / Daffodil) - trumpet	1 scape
Class 4	<i>Narcissu</i> (Narcissus / Daffodil) - double	1 scape
Class 5	<i>Narcissu</i> (Narcissus / Daffodil) - large cup yellow	1 scape
Class 6	<i>Narcissu</i> (Narcissus / Daffodil) - large cup non-yellow	1 scape
Class 7	<i>Narcissu</i> (Narcissus / Daffodil) - miniature	1 scape
Class 8	<i>Narcissu</i> (Narcissus / Daffodil) - small cup	1 scape
Class 9	<i>Narcissu</i> (Narcissus / Daffodil) - multi-flowered	1 scape
Class 10	<i>Narcissu</i> (Narcissus / Daffodil) - any other type not mentioned above <i>*Trumpet applies to the cultivars that have coronas, as long as, or longer than the petal. For the large cup, the trumpet is more than 1/3 of the length of the petal; but less than the full length; the small cup is less than 1/3 the size of the petals.</i>	1 scape
Class 11	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - lily flower	1 bloom
Class 12	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - parrot	1 bloom
Class 13	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - peony type	1 bloom
Class 14	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - red	1 bloom
Class 15	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - pink	1 bloom
Class 16	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - yellow or orange	1 bloom
Class 17	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - white or cream	1 bloom

Class 18	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - purple or black	1 bloom
Class 19	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - fringed	1 bloom
Class 20	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - bi-coloured	1 bloom
Class 21	<i>Tulipa</i> (Tulip) - any other type or colour not listed above <i>*No more than 2 leaves should be attached to the tulip stem.</i>	1 bloom
Class 22	Any spring bulb other than any mentioned above	1 bloom
Class 23	Perennial, any other	1 stem, named
Class 24	A collection of perennial flowers other than above	3 varieties, 1 stem of each in 1 container, named
Class 25	One branch of a flowering tree or shrub	1 branch, max. length 36" above the table
Class 26	Asparagus *	3 stalks, max. 8" in length
Class 27	Rhubarb *	3 stalks, heels left on, leaves trimmed to a 2" fan
Class 28	Houseplant grown for foliage **	1 pot
Class 29	<i>Cactus</i> **	1 pot
Class 30	<i>Saintpaulia</i> (African Violet) **	1 plant in 1 pot
Class 31	Succulent – other than cactus **	1 pot
Class 32	A plant or plants grown in an unusual container **	1 pot

* Paper plates will be available.

** You must own the plant for Classes 28 thru 32 for more than 3 months.

DIVISION 2 – DESIGN CLASSES		
		Comments
Class 33A	Woodland Tea - A small design using a teacup AND saucer featuring woodland flowers.	Small design must be no larger than 10 inches in any direction.
Class 33B	Same as above, but for beginner exhibitors	
Class 34A	Woodland Theme - A design using foliage and tree material (i.e., log, bark).	Design is to be no larger than 24 inches in any direction.
Class 34B	Same as above, but for beginner exhibitors	


* Black table clothes will be used for Design Classes.

** Remember: No harmful, poisonous or invasive plants; no scarce, protected or endangered species; no cut fruit or artificial plant material; no soil is permitted in design entries.

The Entrant No. will be assigned to you on show day at the Horticultural Show Registrant table.
